if there is no trash on the street to focus on when you visit, consider the work destroyed.

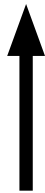

1. Enter the Walnut Creek Trail at the Garden View trailhead.

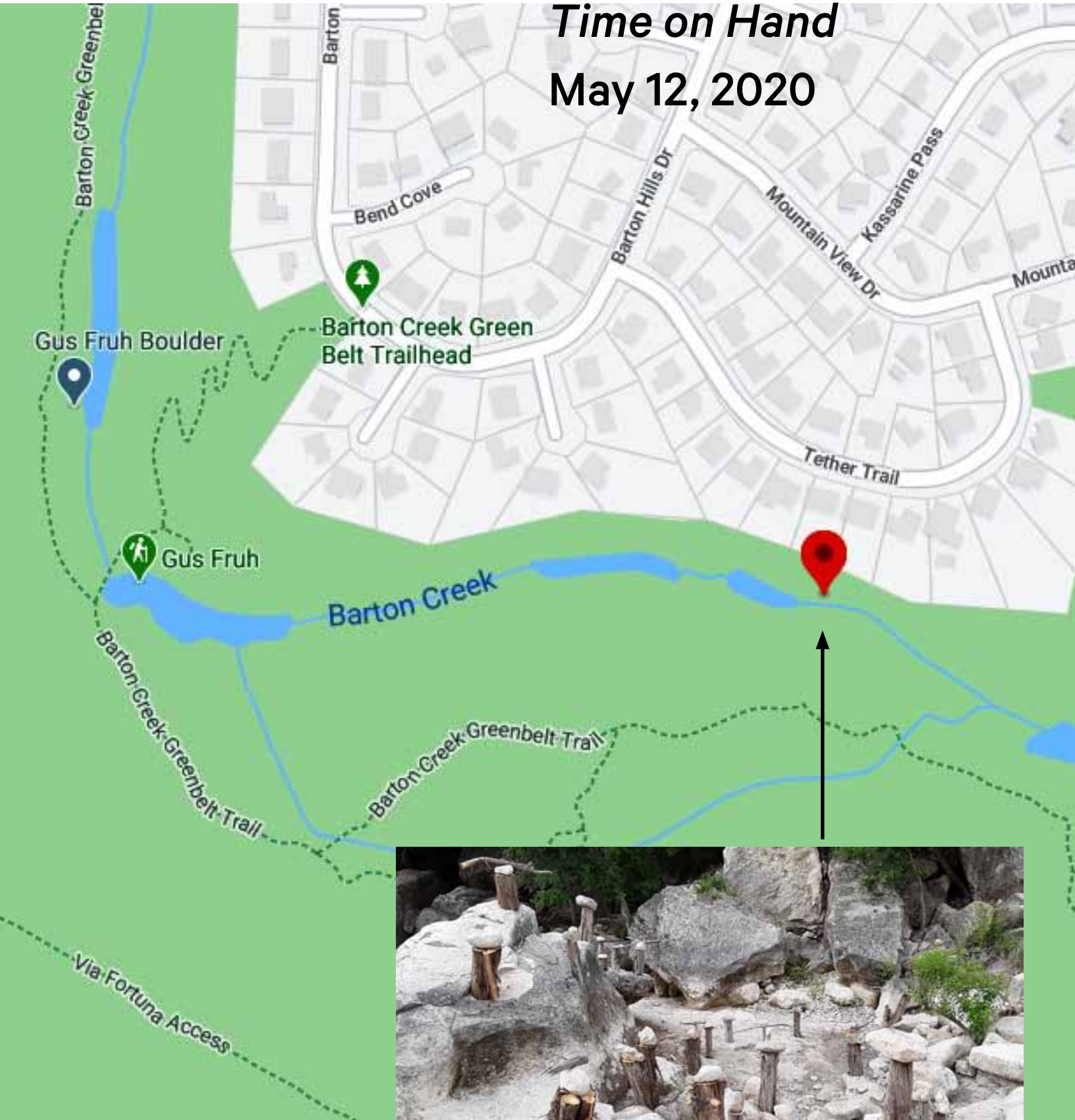
2. From the trailhead turn right and then turn right again to head south on the main trail.

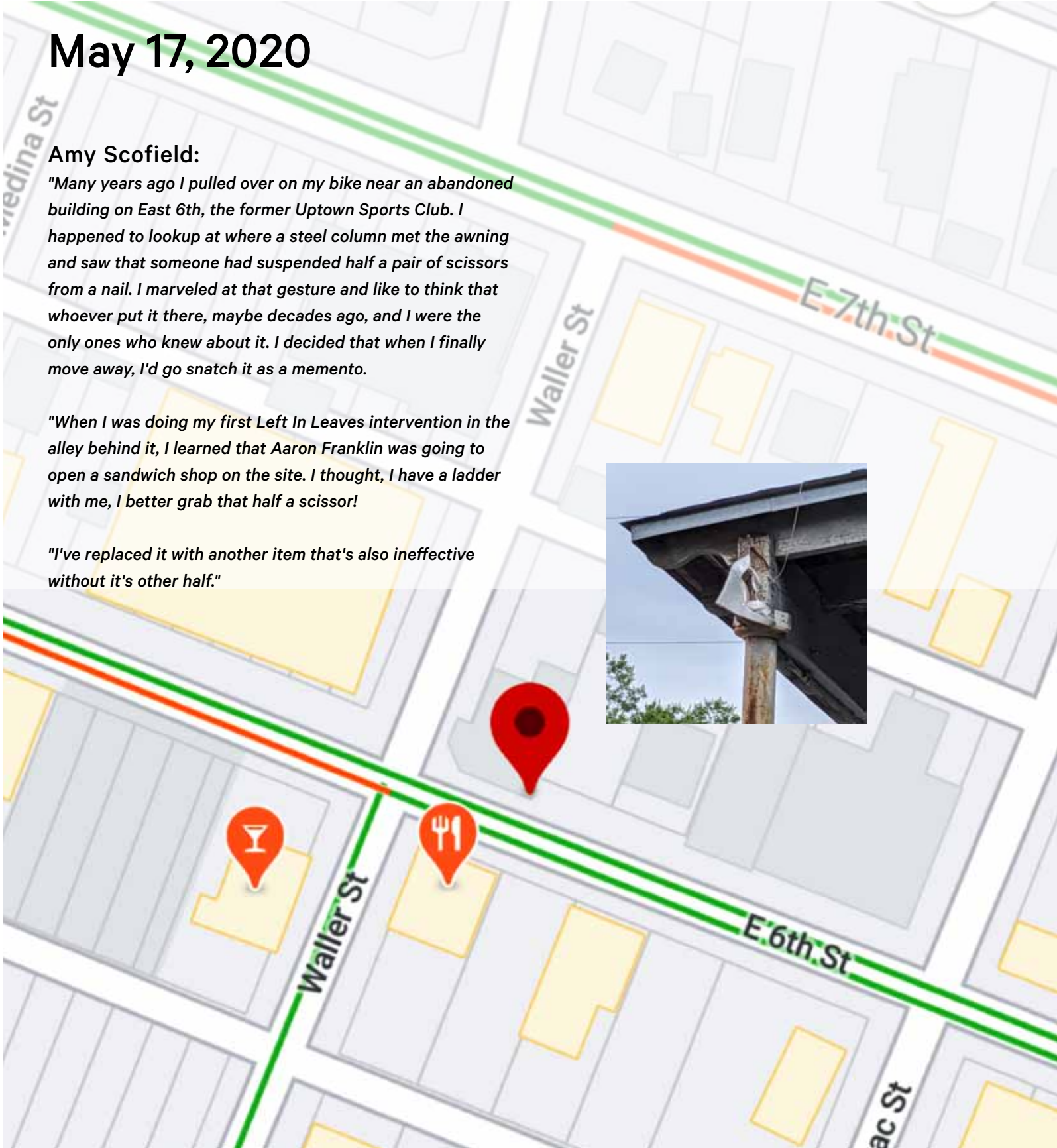

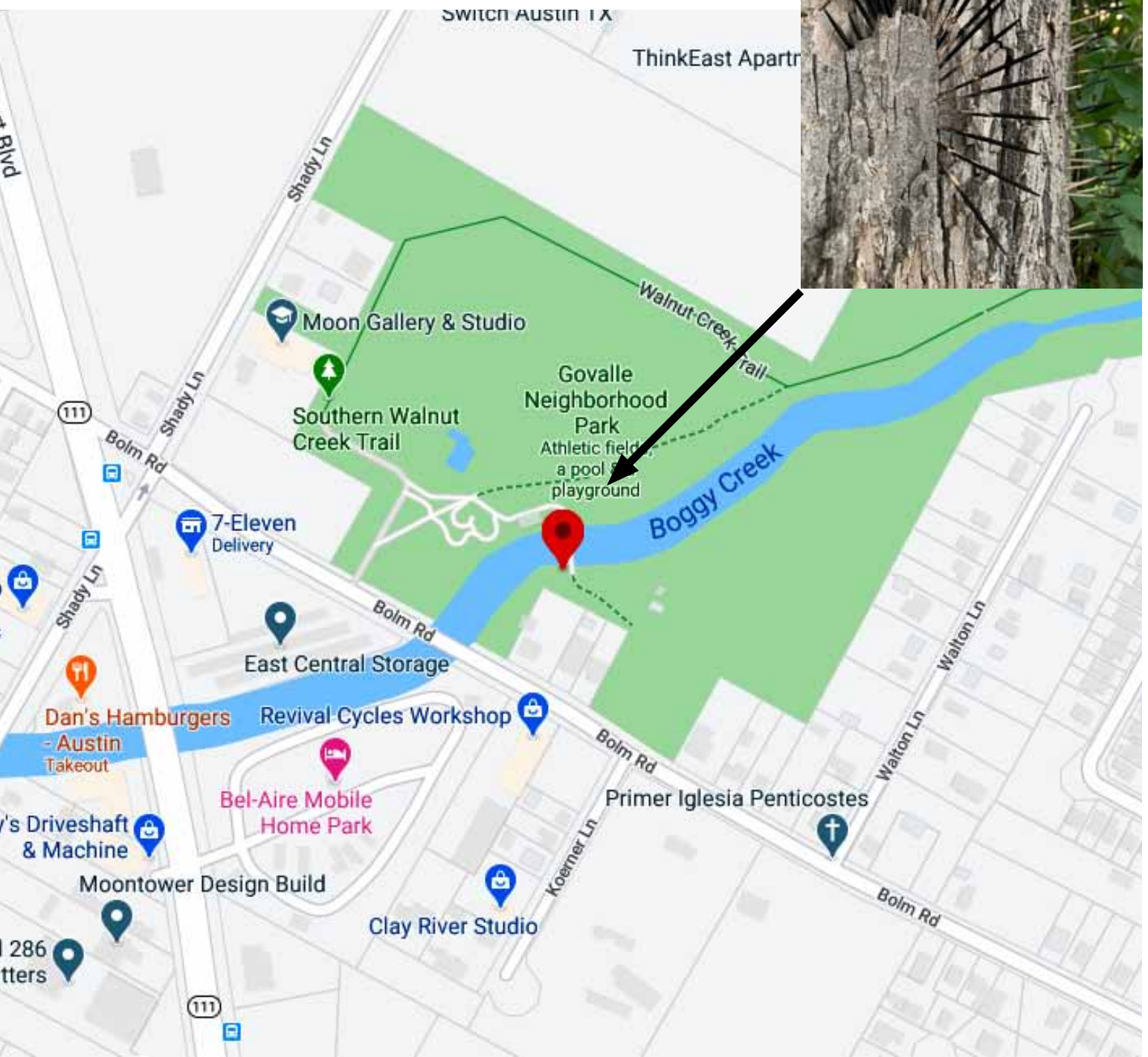
"I've replaced it with another item that's also ineffective without it's other half."

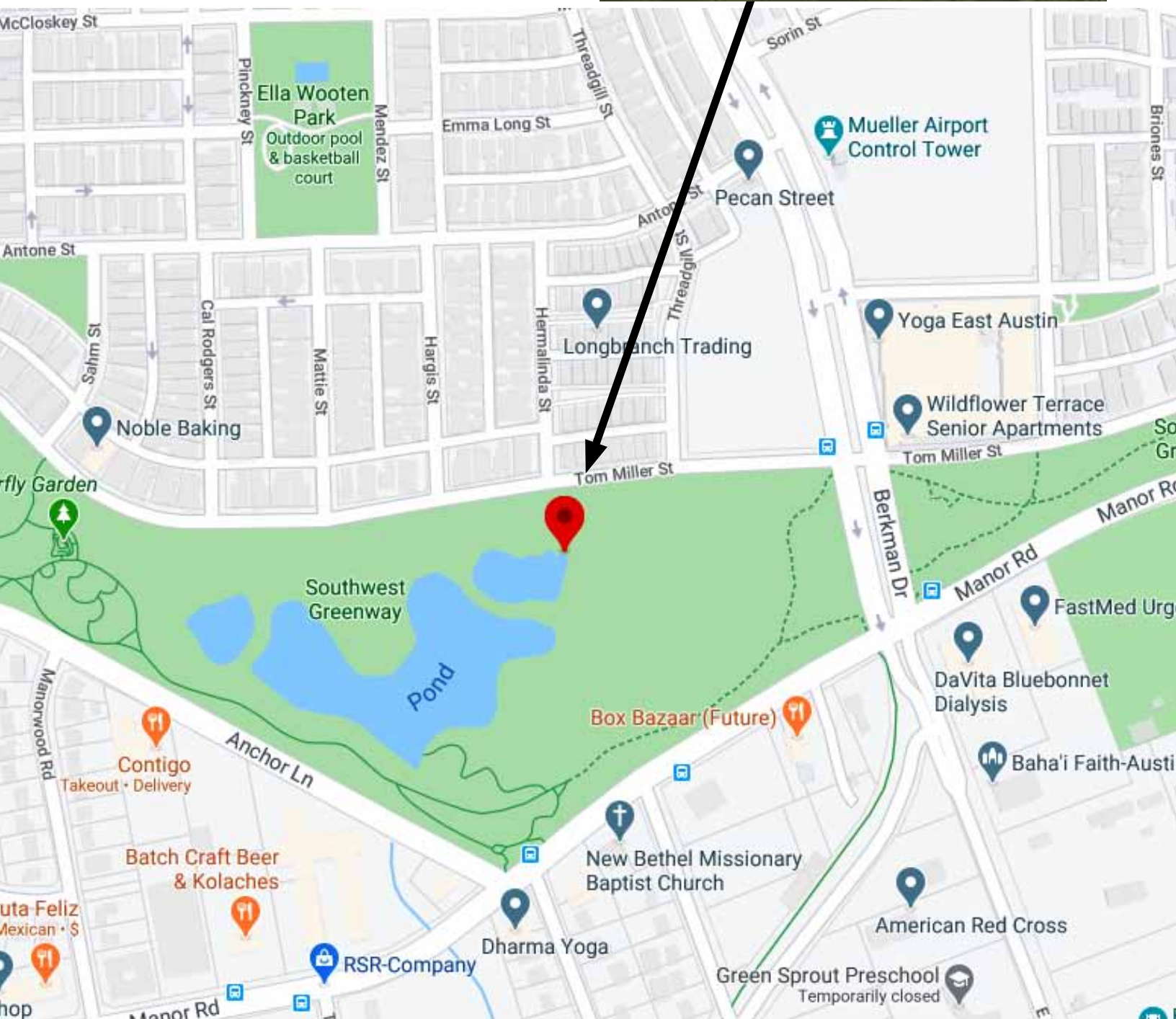
Walnut Creek trail behind Govalle Park

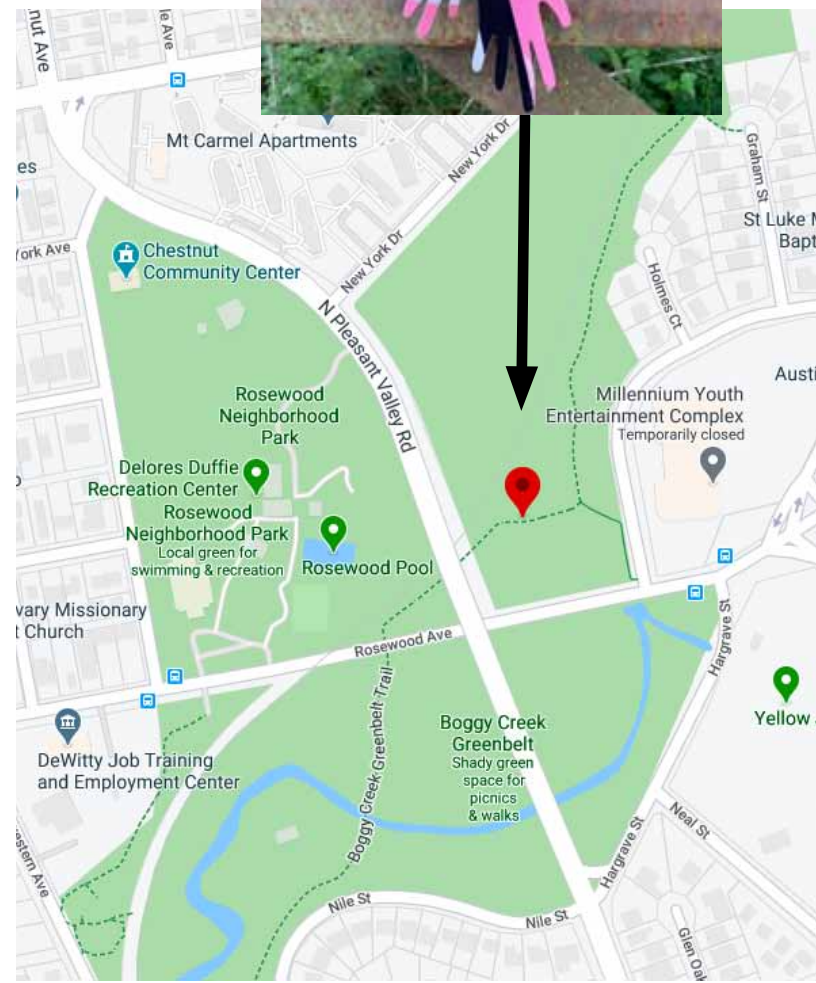
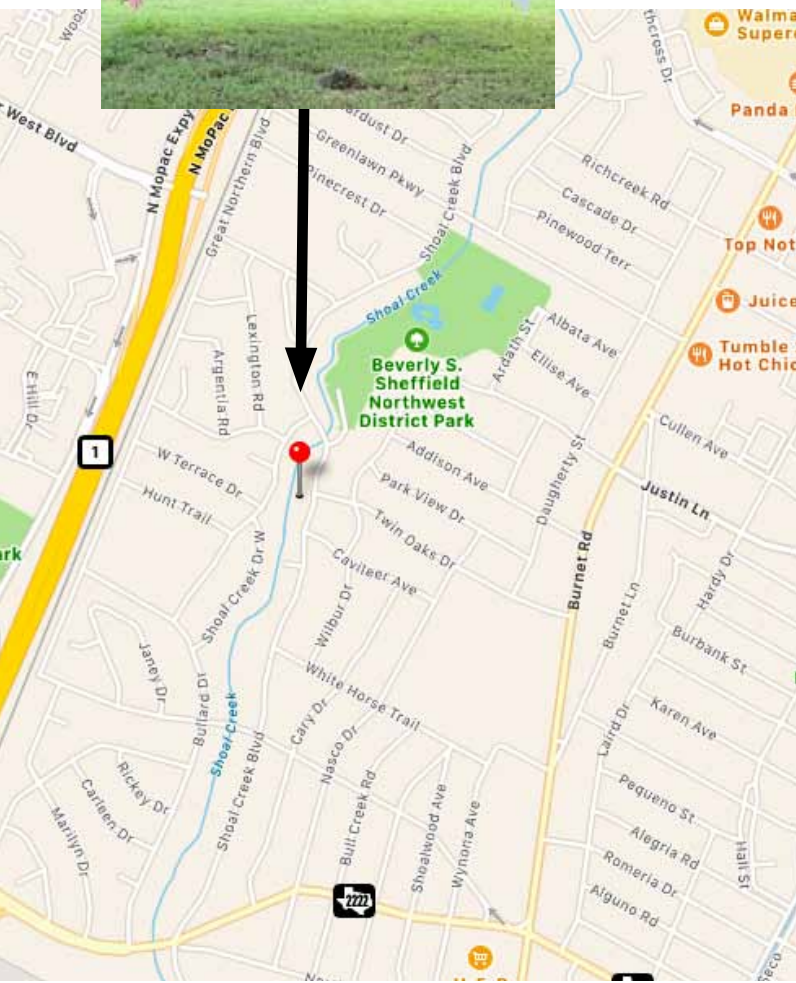

From the curb or car window open the Artivive app and frame the installation in the viewfinder. This will trigger a digital experience. Enjoy!

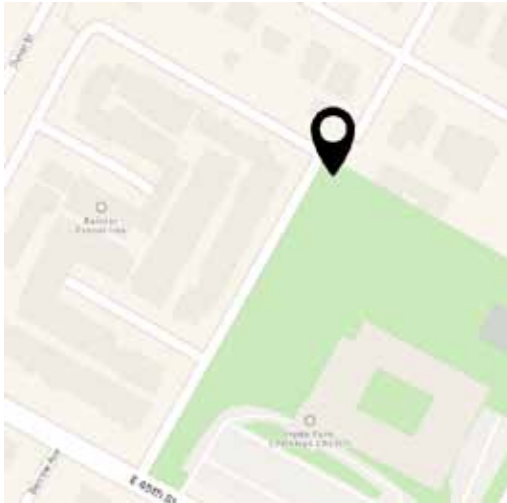
Driving Directions (from downtown):

- Turn right onto Eastcrest Dr.

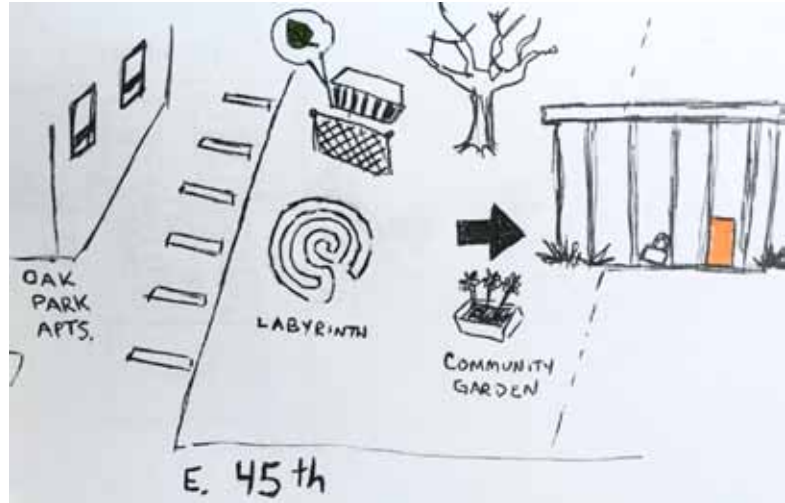

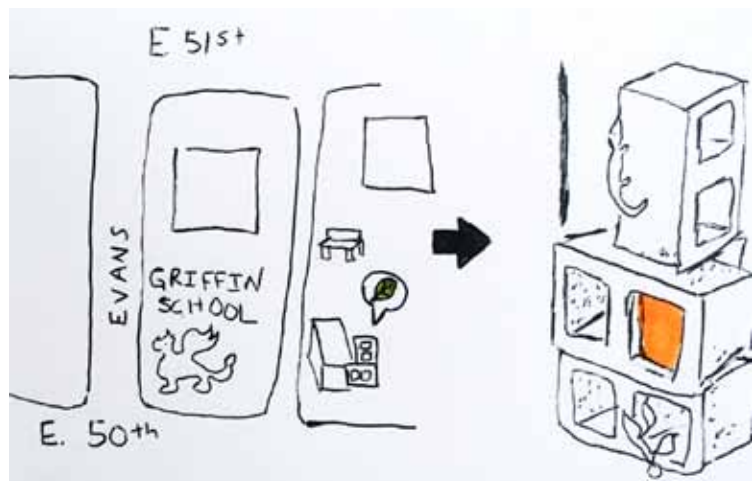

Red Bluff Nature Preserve

Brass ornaments rescued from a Chinese restaurant that's being replaced by a Big Box are relocated to a Chinese Pistache tree in the Red Bluff Nature Preserve.

Scofield writes:

"New thoughts on climate change suggest that invasive tree species may have a better chance of survival than natives. Little cafes don't have a chance but nature finds a way."

Directions:

① [Red Bluff Nature Preserve](#) can only be accessed from the end of Harold Court Rd, which can only be accessed via the Southbound 183 Frontage Road.



② Go to the end of Harold Ct Rd, near 6116-5904 Harold Ct., Look for the broken curb and follow the dirt path to a clearing, walking southwest.

③ At the clearing, take a left turn into the woods just before a power pole.

④ Follow the path as it loops around the tree with really shaggy bark and look up.

⑤ Head back out the same way then turn left at the clearing. Follow the map for an extra surprise on the right.
